





Final Walkthrough Inspection Checklist

Exterior Inspection
Structure: Check the condition of the home's exterior walls, looking for cracks or damage.
Roof: Look for missing or damaged shingles and signs of leaks.
\square Gutters and Downspouts: Ensure they are intact, secure, and clear of debris.
\square Windows and Doors: Check for damage, proper sealing, and smooth operation.

Specific Areas
Kitchen: Inspect countertops, cabinets, and appliances for functionality and damage.
\square Bathrooms: Check for leaks, proper water flow, and functioning toilets.
Basement/Attic: Look for signs of leaks, moisture, or pests.
Utility Services: Confirm that electrical, gas, and water services are operational.
Safety Features
\square Smoke and Carbon Monoxide Detectors: Ensure they are in place and working.
Fire Extinguishers: Check the expiration date if present.
Security System: Test the system if the property is equipped with one.
Agreed-Upon Repairs
Verify that all repairs agreed upon after the home inspection or during negotiations have been completed satisfactorily.
Miscellaneous
Personal Property: Ensure that any items included in the sale, such as window treatments or light fixtures, are present and in condition expected.
\square Cleanliness: The home should be reasonably clean and free of debris.
Manuals and Warranties: Collect any manuals, warranties, and codes for appliances and home systems.

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Final Steps

\square Confirm the next steps and timeline for closing with your agent.
